He is not coming to relive the past. 22 "see one of the days" He is not coming to reproduce this world. 23 "Do not go out..." He is not coming with time for change. 24 "as the lightning flashes" He is coming to reverse His rejection. 25 "first He must suffer"

The Kingdom came with the King. 17:20-21

The Kingdom is objective, but not observable. 20 "not with observable signs" The Kingdom is personal, public, and practical. 21 "is in your midst"

The King is coming for His Kingdom. 17:22-25

The King is coming as Sovereign, not servant. 22 "days of the Son of Man" The King is coming everywhere, not just there. 23 "Do not… chase after them" The King is coming imminently, and instantaneously. 24 "as the lightning flashes" The King's first coming was prophesied (cross) and proved (resurrection). 25

Finding Jesus on planet Earth. 17:20-21

Sceptics can't see Him. 20a "asked by the Pharisees" Some seek alternatives. 21a "Look, here it is" Seekers will find Him. 21b "is in your midst"
