Key word commentary

³His Divine power has **granted** us

δεδωρημένης is a verb, a perfect middle or passive participle, a genitive feminine singular, of the verb δωρέομαι [Strongs 1433]. The word comes from the more common word, of 416 occurrences, δίδωμι [Strongs 1325] meaning 'to give'.

This word, δωρέομαι, means, 'to give, to present, grant, bestow'. This word occurs only 3 times in the Greek New Testament, including twice in 2 Peter. Those occurrences are:

When Pilate had confirmed the death of Jesus with the centurion, he **granted** the body to Joseph of Arimathea. Mark 15:45

His Divine power has **granted** us everything we need for life and godliness... 2 Peter 1:3

He has granted us His precious and magnificent promises. 2 Peter 1:4

3...through the **rich knowledge** of Him

There are 16 occurrences of the word 'knowledge' in English in 1 & 2 Peter, but 4 different words in the original Greek.

οἶδα, 5 occurrences in 1 & 2 Peter 1 Peter 1:18. 5:9, 2 Peter 1:12, 1:14, 2:9

γνῶσις, 6 occurrences in 1 & 2 Peter 1 Peter 3:7, 2 Peter 1:5, 1:6, 1:20, 3:3, 3:18

ἐπίγνωσις, 4 occurrences in 1 & 2 Peter

2 Peter 1:2, 1:3, 1:8, 2:20

ἄγνοια, 1 occurrence in 1 & 2 Peter

1 Peter 1:14

The word used in this verse is ἐπιγνώσεως a genitive feminine singular noun form of the noun ἐπίγνωσις [Strongs 1922]. This word occurs 20 times in the Greek New Testament including 4 times (20% of all uses) in 2 Peter. This word is a compound word consisting of the prefix preposition ἐπί [Strongs 1909] which intensifies νῶσις [Strongs 1108] a noun meaning, 'knowledge gleaned from first-hand personal experience'.

Therefore, ἐπιγνώσεως means an intimate knowledge grown through a deeper, richer, relationship.

4... now that you have **escaped** the desire for corruption in the world ἀποφεύγω [Strongs 668] is a compound verb, consisting of the prefix preposition ἀπό

[Strongs 575] meaning, 'away from'; plus the verb φεύγω [Strongs 5343] meaning, 'escape, flee, run away'.

Hence, this word, ἀποφεύγω means, 'flee away from, escape by flight' indicating a deliberate disconnection and separation by distance.

This word occurs only 3 times in Scripture, and is found only in 2 Peter. Those occurrences:

Through these He has granted us His precious and magnificent promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the Divine nature, now that you have **escaped** the desire for corruption in the world 2 Peter 1:4, BSB

With lofty but empty words, they appeal to the sensual passions of the flesh and entice those who are just **escaping** from others who live in error. 2 Peter 2:18

If indeed they have **escaped** the corruption of the world through the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, only to be entangled and overcome by it again, their final condition is worse than it was at first.2 Peter 2:20, BSB

- 1. Is your glass half-full, or half-empty? How full is your glass, most of the time?
- 2. How much overlap is there between a) a life that is abundant, and b) a life that is happy, or prosperous, or successful, or famous, or easy? How can we define an abundant life?
