Commentary

Abide | Abiding

μένω [Strongs 3306] a verb meaning abide, remain, stay, wait.

Of the 118 occurrences of this word in the New Testament, 67 of those occurrences (57%) are in John's writings. 40 times in John's Gospel, 24 times in 1 John, and 3 times in 2 John. The word occurs only twice by Peter; both occasions are here in 1 Peter 1:23 and 1:25.

Word | Wisdom

Λόγος [Strongs 3056] a noun meaning word, statement, wisdom, rationale, reasoning expressed by words. Pre-eminently used as a title of Christ in John 1:1. A frequently used word occurring 331 times in the New Testament, with 10 of those occurrences in 1 & 2 Peter, including here in 1 Peter 1:23.

From $\lambda \dot{\epsilon} \gamma \omega$ [Strongs 3004] meaning say, speak, "laying an argument to rest," that is, bringing a message to closure, moving to a conclusion.

Utterance | Saying

ἡῆμα [Strongs 4487] meaning, say, speak, tell, answer, bid, bring word, call, command. A noun found 70 times in the New Testament, including twice, here in 1 Peter 1:25, and once in 2 Peter 3:2. The emphasis is on interpersonal (often verbal) communication.
