<sup>34</sup>I tell you, on that night two people will be in one bed: One will be taken and the other left.
<sup>35</sup>Two women will be grinding grain together: One will be taken and the other left."
<sup>37</sup>"Where, Lord?" they asked.

Jesus answered, "Wherever there is a carcass, there the vultures will gather."

Naturally, and sensibly, they [the disciples] wanted to know where the one taken, was being taken to. But Jesus did not give a simple answer. He did not say, 'Taken to Heaven'. Nor did He say, 'Taken to Hell.' Instead, He gave a parable-like answer that requires some thought on the part of the listener. So, let's listen, carefully, to Jesus.

Jesus answered, "Wherever there is a carcass, there the vultures will gather." (Luke 17:37)

Now that you have heard Jesus' answer, carefully consider what He has just said. Look at those words so that you truly understand where those who are taken, are taken to. Does He describe the place where they are taken as a place of life, or a place of death? Does Jesus describe where they are taken as a happy place; a place of peace; a place of joy; or are they taken to a place death and destruction? Read His words again, if you are unsure.

Jesus' teaching about one taken, and one left behind, is obviously clear. The one who is taken, is taken away to death and destruction; a place of weeping and gnashing of teeth; a place of pain and sorrow. When one is taken and one is left behind, it is obviously the unsaved who are taken, and the believers who are left behind.

This orderly sequence is consistent with everything else Jesus has taught about His return. For example, in the parable of the wheat and the weeds (Matthew 13:24-30) and His detailed explanation (Matthew 13:36-43), Jesus first stated the meaning of the symbols:

<sup>38</sup>The field is the world, and the good seed represents the sons of the Kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one, <sup>39</sup>and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels.

He then explained the orderly sequence:

<sup>30</sup>Let both grow together until the harvest. At that time, I will tell the harvesters: **First collect the weeds** and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat into my barn... <sup>40</sup>As the weeds are collected and burned in the fire, so will it be at the end of the age. <sup>41</sup>The Son of Man will send out His angels, and they will weed out of His Kingdom every cause of sin and all who practice lawlessness. <sup>42</sup>And they will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>43</sup>**Then** the righteous will shine like the sun in the Kingdom of their Father.

Problems with understanding the Second Coming arise only when otherwise wellintentioned Bible teachers fail to make Jesus their foundation, and they begin with somewhere else in Scripture, such as: <sup>15</sup>By the word of the Lord, we declare to you that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who have fallen asleep. <sup>16</sup>For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a loud command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will be the first to rise. <sup>17</sup>After that, we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will always be with the Lord. (1 Thessalonians 4:15-17)

This Scripture describes two groups of people. Please re-read those verses, and identify those two groups. You found this: a) Dead Christians "the dead in Christ" (v16), and b) Living Christians "we who are alive and **remain**" (v17). Since there are only dead Christians, and living Christians, which group is conspicuous by their absence? The non-Christians are not mentioned, because Jesus has taught us that they are the "weeds... who are removed first" (Matthew 13:30). The "dead in Christ will be the first to rise" (1 Thessalonians 4:16) out of the only two groups that are left after the unsaved are removed.

Problems in theology only arise when we fail to begin with Jesus; when we fail to make Jesus the foundation for every aspect of our Faith. But when we begin with Jesus, the world's greatest teacher, we learn the sequence of the Second Coming is:

First, remove the weeds, when one is taken to where the vultures gather.

Next, the dead in Christ rise as the first of those who remain.

Finally, we who are alive and remain get to witness all this and then meet the Lord in the air.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Wherever there is a carcass, there the vultures will gather." (Luke 17:37)

There are some commentators who want the carcass of v37 to be taken to Heaven, and so, contrary to the clear meaning of this verse, they retranslate "vultures" to be "eagles". The noun in the Greek New Testament is  $\dot{\alpha}\epsilon\tau\dot{\alpha}\varsigma$  [Strongs 105] which means any large bird of prey, and depending on the context can be legitimately translated as either vulture or eagle. The action of these birds of prey is to  $\dot{\epsilon}\pi\iota\sigma\nuv\dot{\alpha}\gamma\omega$  [Strongs 1996]. This is a compound word, consisting of the preposition,  $\dot{\epsilon}\pi\iota$  [Strongs 1909] meaning "on", plus the verb  $\sigma\nuv\dot{\alpha}\gamma\omega$  [Strongs 4863] meaning "assemble, come together, gather". Therefore, this action is "to come together on" the body. This action, which is typical of a flock of vultures, is in contrast to an eagle, which is a solitary hunter of live prey.

Once again, read Jesus' answer. "Wherever there is a carcass, there the [birds of prey] will gather." The context in this verse clearly calls for the translation to be "vultures". The image is of multiple vultures gathered on the carcass of their victim.

The next question to ask is: 'On what are the vultures gathered?' The answer is on a  $\sigma \tilde{\omega} \mu \alpha$  [Strongs 4983] which means, a body. The body is that part of a person that can be killed, and with the soul,  $\psi \upsilon \chi \dot{\eta}$  [Strongs 5590] be cast into Hell (Matthew 10:28). The body on which the vultures are gathered, is nothing more than a body. Hence, a dead body, or as it is correctly translated, a carcass.

Now, discard the sanitised – and false – image of the Rapture, and replace it with the true image of the unsaved being Removed. Then, put this image, as Jesus paints it, back into its actual Biblical context of verses 34-37. One will be taken, and one will be left behind. When the disciples asked where the one who is taken, will be taken to, Jesus' answer is a description of their destiny being nothing but death, pain, and destruction.

Other signs that we are in the last days / end times

<sup>1</sup> Now the Spirit expressly states that **in later times** some will abandon the faith to follow deceitful spirits and the teachings of demons, <sup>2</sup> influenced by the hypocrisy of liars, whose consciences are seared with a hot iron. 1 Timothy 4:1-2

But **in these last days** He has spoken to us by His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, and through whom He made the universe. Hebrews 1:2

<sup>3</sup> Most importantly, you must understand that **in the last days** scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires. <sup>4</sup> "Where is the promise of His coming?" they will ask. "Ever since our fathers fell asleep, everything continues as it has from the beginning of creation." 2 Peter 3:3-4

when they said to you, "In the last times there will be scoffers who will follow after their own ungodly desires." Jude 1:18

Other prophetic signs, such as "wars and rumours of war, earthquakes, and famines" are not signs of the Second Coming but of the destruction of Jerusalem. See Sermon Inspiration notes for Matthew 24, Mark 13, or Luke 21.

Summary of the probable sequence of the Second Coming

# Return

"I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with Me, so that you also may be where I am." (John 14:2-3) Note that Jesus clearly states the purpose of His return is not to set up an earthly Kingdom. He said He is coming back to collect us and take us to be with Him. [Note Renewal, below, there will no longer be an earth!]

"The Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God" (1 Thessalonians 4:16)

# Removal

"Let both [weeds and wheat] grow together until the harvest. At that time, I will tell the harvesters: First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn." (Matthew 13:30) "...The Son of Man will send out his

angels, and they will weed out of his kingdom everything that causes sin and all who do evil. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Matthew 13:41-42) Jesus divides humanity into 2 groups – the saved and the lost. He says the first group to go will be the lost; the weeds.

# Resurrection

"The Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first." (1 Thessalonians 4:16) When the weeds; the lost are removed, Paul divides the remaining people into 2 groups: the dead Christians, and the living Christians. Of these 2 groups it is the dead believers who are raised first, leaving us living Christians to witness it all.

## Rapture

"After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so, we will be with the Lord forever." (1 Thessalonians 4:17)

# Renewal

"The day of the Lord will come like a thief [in the night], when the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed." (2 Peter 3:10)

"Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away... And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people..." (Revelation 21:1-3)

## Reward

"Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven..."
