Build trust though credibility. 4-5
Credible words lead to actions of trust

Share your successes. 6-7

(credibility leads to trust. Trust leads to following directions. Following a trusted and credible leader leads to...) Celebration leads to generosity. cp. scarcity mentality leads to fight the competition. ie. win/lose cf. innovation mentality leads to leading the competition. ie. win/learn

Every response is a stepping stone. 8-10

- a) "Depart from me" I don't want to be challenged or to change
- b) "I am sinful" I can't do it. I'm not good enough / gifted enough / resourced enough / smart enough... etc
- c) "Lord" The difference is too great. The target is too high.

 Jesus does not address any of these excuses. They are all from the head. Jesus bypasses them and goes deeper. He addresses the heart. "Don't be afraid." Fear is more limiting than lack of financial resources or lack of innovative ideas

Jesus is directive. "...you will..." not "you can" or "try to" But they couldn't! Present a plan. "...catch men." wholeistic / heart and head
